Executive Committee Meeting Minutes – June 16, 2003

The Hunters Glen Home Owners Executive Committee met June 16, 2003, at 7:00 p.m. at the home of Chuck Gorsuch. Present were Chuck Gorsuch, Tom Shepherd, Brenta Poole, Chuck Nordgren and Dave Alperin.

Walter Sinclair, former treasurer, has sent a letter to the new owner of the property along Hwy 64.

Chuck Nordgren reported that 10 more people have paid their dues.

Chuck Gorsuch reported that he had checked regulations on open burning. It is allowed only for brush from the property on which the burning takes place from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. However, burning cannot be a nuisance. Chuck will write an article in the environment for the next newsletter.

Tom Shepherd reported that Fred Robinson suggested that everyone be given copies of the covenants. Brenta will type up an unofficial amended copy to be sent out with the September newsletter.

Tom suggested that the welcome committee deliver a copy of the covenants when they visit new people. It was suggested that a packet include the covenants, a copy of the most recent newsletter, and perhaps some coupons from merchants in Horse Shoe Plaza.

Other suggestions included yard of the month, a neighborhood yard sale. In the next newsletter, Dave will ask for a volunteer to head up the yard sale. The newsletter will also have notes from the president and a report from the treasurer.

It was decided that we will not plan social functions for the whole community but that it would be good for the different areas to get together.

Chuck Gorsuch will contact the community watch people to see if they are still willing to serve in that capacity. There will be a blurb in the next newsletter to the effect that everyone needs to help with this.

Roane Smith has brought up the possibility of our having a web site similar to the one for Hawthorne Hills ([hawthorne-hills.org](http://hawthorne-hills.org)). Roane has no experience with this but has volunteered to help.
